



Fire, Emergency & Security Systems (FESS) Apprenticeship Standard - All Ages



BEFORE YOU START

- 1) You must be employed before you can enrol onto an apprenticeship.
- 2) The apprenticeship training programme typically takes around 3 years to complete.
- 3) You do not pay for your training and will earn while you learn.



APPRENTICESHIP STANDARD

During your apprenticeship you'll develop practical skills and knowledge both on the job and with a training provider.
You'll follow one of four 'pathways' depending on your employer's specialism: Fire; Security; Fire and Security or Fire and Emergency Lighting.



END POINT ASSESSMENT

To complete your apprenticeship you'll take the FESS End Point Assessment which tests everything you've learnt during your training.



QUALIFIED FESS TECHNICIAN

Once you've passed your End Point Assessment your apprenticeship is complete and you'll be a qualified Fire, Emergency and Security Systems Technician (title depends on your chosen pathway).
